

Digitalis grandiflora – Yellow Foxglove

Soft yellow flowers appear in summer and continue into fall. Attracts birds and butterflies.

All parts of plant are poisonous if ingested.

Growing Requirements

Prefers part-shade in humus-rich soil, but can tolerate sun. Grows in clumps.

Planting

Height: 24-36” Spacing:15-24”

Care

Very low maintenance. If the flowering stalk is cut down after blooms have faded, it may re-bloom in the fall. When a few flower stalks are left, the plant self-seeds. Requires consistently moist soil; do not let dry out between watering.

Pests/Diseases

Deer resistant.

Dividing /Propagating

By dividing the root ball or from seed; direct sow outdoors in fall or in spring after last frost.
