"Keys to Successful Composting"

- Selecting materials suitable for composting
- Choosing a good location for a compost pile
- Maintaining a compost pile

"Keeping Pests Out of the Garden" Insect and Disease Management

- Identifying Integrated Pest Management strategies
- Attracting beneficial insects to a vegetable garden
- Identifying common insects and diseases found in vegetable gardens
- Using cultural methods of insect and disease management

"Harvesting and Food Safety in the Vegetable Garden"

- Choosing the best time of day to harvest vegetables
- Knowing when specific vegetables are ready to be harvested
- Choosing the best storage option for specific vegetables
- Implementing food safety strategies for community gardens
- Practicing personal hygiene that promotes food safety in the garden

THE TOURS: Each program will start with a tour of the Rutgers Master Gardeners "Sharing Garden" located in the Demonstration Garden at Trailside. Since 2002, Master Gardeners have grown over 31,000 pounds of produce for local food pantries. The tour for the evening will focus on the evening's program topic.
